

GAS SAFETY AFTER EARTHQUAKES

Turn **OFF** the gas **ONLY** when:

1. You **smell** natural gas, or
2. You **hear** a hissing sound, or
3. You **see** the gas meter dial spinning

Leave the gas on unless you notice any of the above.

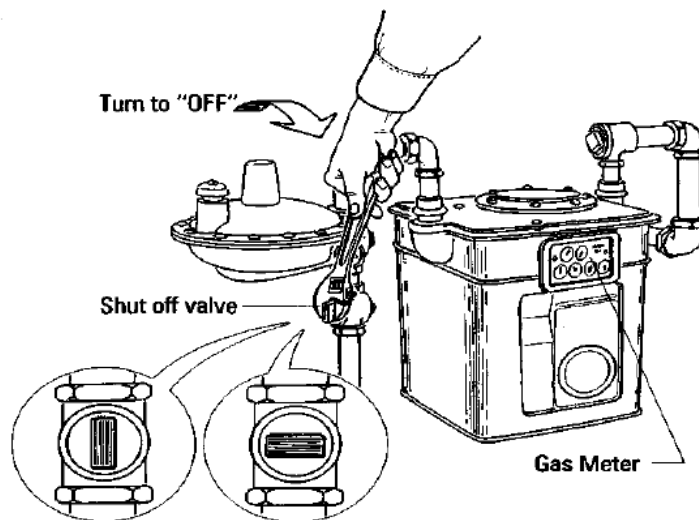
If you turn off the gas, PG&E must turn it back on for you...Never turn gas back on yourself!

Check your gas valve periodically by turning it 1/8 turn in either direction and then turning it back 1/8 turn to the vertical ON position. A 1/8 turn will not turn your gas off. Use a 10-12" crescent wrench or other gas shutoff tool. Contact PG&E if you are unable to turn the valve.

How to Turn Gas OFF

Turn the valve ¼ turn, in either direction, so the valve is crosswise or horizontal to the pipe.
